SERVICE DEFINITIONS

REATMENT FOSTER CARE PLACEMENT LEVEL DESCRIPTIONS:

on Treatment Foster Care - Children served at the non-treatment level of foster care may be developmentally on target, demonstrate age appropriate behaviors, able to articipate in community activities without restriction, or be the sibling of a child who meets the criteria for ongoing TFC placement in the same foster home. Children shall be evved at the Non-treatment Foster Care level if the assessment indicates treatment foster care services are not needed.

evel 1 Treatment Foster Care (Mild) — A child served at Level 1 ongoing treatment foster care will demonstrate a mild level of social/emotional/behavioral/medical/personal care eeds or impalment for normal range of age and development; such as but not limited to, depression, anxiety, impulsivity, hyperactivity, anger control, adjustment to trauma, positional, substance use, eating disorder, physical health condition, developmental delay, or intellectual. The child's needs require monitoring or agency may need to provide arvices to lessen likelihood needs will return

evel 2 Treatment Foster Care (Moderate) - A child served at Level 2 ongoing treatment foster care will demonstrate a moderate level of ocial/emotional/behavioral/medical/personal care needs or impairment for normal range of age and development; such as but not limited to, depression, anxiety, impulsivity, yperactivity, anger control, adjustment to trauma, oppositional, substance use, eating disorder, physical health condition, developmental delay, or intellectual. The child's needs equire that action (interventions, services, supports, etc.) be taken to address, remedy or ameliorate the needs.

evel 3 Treatment Foster Care (Significant) —. A child served at Level 3 ongoing treatment foster care will demonstrate a significant level of policial/emotional/behavioral/medical/personal care needs or impairment for normal range of age and development; such as but not limited to, depression, anxiety, impulsivity, yperactivity, anger control, adjustment to trauma, oppositional, substance use, eating disorder, physical health condition, developmental delay, or intellectual. The child's needs re of such aculty or severity that they require intensive action (interventions, services, supports, etc.) be taken to address, remedy or ameliorate the needs. A child served at this well may be at risk of residential placement.

esessment Level - For the purposes of determining an appropriate placement level when that determination is needed, for up to 60 days.

THER FOSTER CARE SERVICES

<u>linship Care Search</u> - This service includes the search for an appropriate relative or fictive kin.

inship Care - Designed to meet needs of youth who would benefit from placement with a relative or fictive kin. Homestudy is completed at no expense to locality. Once placed upervision and support is provided to family as either a kinship placement or reunification case.

hild Specific Recruitment

or children for whom a permanent plan has not been successfully implemented, child specific recruitment may be utilized. Using the child's history, including interviews with the nild, their family and other individuals significant in the child's life, an attempt is made to locate a potentially permanent placement for the child. No expense to the referring gency is included until the child is placed. At this time, if a potential adoption match occurs in a DePaul resource family home, then at that time regular rates apply based on lacement Level (our recruiters place many children in homes that are not DePaul homes, so in those instances no charges apply).

mergency Placement After Hours

mergency Placements after regular business hours are available. Access these services by contacting the office and calling the on-call number.

oster care/Independent Living Travel

DePaul will bill for a youth's transportation needs for court appearances, visitation and other unique travel needs beyond 70 miles from each site ocation.

COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES

amily Engagement Services

amily Engagement Services – develops a needs – based care plan with parents and families with the goal of enhancing family functioning to prevent out-of-home placement of hildren or prepare for the return of children from out-of-home placement. The service is tailored to meet the needs of each family and can include parenting skills, life skills, (e.g. nding and maintaining housing/employment/transportation/childcare, etc.) coping skills, psychoeducation, supportive counseling, etc., within an attachment-based framework.

amilies Together - Reunification Services

amilies Together - Reunification Services are provided to families whose children are currently in foster care and who have a permanency planning goal of return home. ssessment and case management services, including coached visitation, is provided with the objective of shortening the child's stay in the foster care system. Parenting skills fter assessment may be offered as part of this service, for an additional charge.

ntensive In-Home

itensive In-Home Services are mental health services delivered in the home to children with mental health issues that put them at risk of inpatient or out-of-home placement, amily counseling, individual counseling and service coordination are provided.

upervised Visitation/Coaching

upervised visitation for non-program participants is provided at a DePaul office or community locations and includes coaching & documentation of visitation.

ounseling Assessment

thorough one time assessment, as required by DMAS regulations, is completed on each client prior to the beginning of counseling treatment.

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Therapist's Time in Court

Individual/Family Counseling

Individual and/or Family Counseling is provided to children and families dealing with mental health issues who are currently involved in the child welfare system.

Family Partnership Meeting Facilitation

Family Partnership Meetings focus on engaging families in decision-making regarding services to meet their needs. A trained staff person provides facilitation including services providers and family members. Facilitators provide the documentation of the family partnership meeting to the Department of Social Services and parents.

Therapeutic Mentor Services

Therapeutic Mentoring is a time limited service that aims to improve a youth's daily functioning. Services are designed to meet the needs of individuals who have moderate severe behavioral issues, or whose living situation is such that they would benefit from individual time with a positive role model.

CORE (Creating Opportunities for Resiliency Enhancement) allows DePaul to utilize various service types (Family Engagement Services, supportive counseling, ca management, transportation) to meet the needs of children in Independent Living. The service can be provided to children living with foster families or living in their own apartment. Service goals are determined by DSS and staff assessment. DePaul Staff assess the children's needs utilizing the Child Resiliency Checklist. Core areas of nee and strengths are determined and considered when developing the treatment plan. Services can be delivered to anyone in the household, as long as it is moving the child tower the overall service goals.

Intensive Care Coordination

ICC facilitates necessary services for children at risk of out-or-home placement with the intent of maintaining or transitioning the youth back into the community and a family settir This service follows a High Fidelity Wraparound model that includes a team-based approach to the development of individualized plans that prioritize the stated needs of the ch and family, emphasizing the development of natural supports and self-efficacy.

INDEPENDENT LIVING

Independent Living Arrangement/Services

The Independent Living Program offers youth, ages 18-21 an opportunity to live in an apartment leased by DePaul Community Resources as they learn life skills necessary transition to adulthood. DePaul provides each youth with case management services, a life skills assessment, individualized skill training, group training opportunities, supervisic guidance and support. DePaul provides this service on a level system, which enables the youth to gain a higher level of independence as they successfully work towar achieving their goals. An additional IL maintenance monthly payment is required to cover apartment and living expenses. \$35.00/day in addition for youth with baby/child.

Level 2 - All youth enter the Independent Living Program on Level 2, for a period of at least 60 days, so that their level of need, amount of supervision and assistanrequired can be assessed. Youth on this level will receive a high level of staff intervention, supervision and guidance. Level 1 - Youth on this level have demonstrated and maintained progress towards established goals (employment, vocational) in addition to remaining in complian with program rules and expectations. Youth on Level 1 have shown more independence and require less staff intervention, supervision and guidance.

Independent Living Mentor Home Arrangement/Specialized Services Rate

The Independent Living Program offers youth, ages 18-21, an opportunity to live in a mentor home that has been specifically trained to assist them in the skills necessary transition to adulthood. The specialized services rate includes case management, a life skills assessment, and youth specific individual, as well as group training opportunities. additional IL maintenance monthly payment is required to cover apartment and living expenses

Independent Living Mentor Home Arrangement/Support & Supervision

The support and supervision payment is paid to the mentor home arrangement provider for the provision of increased support and oversight of the youth. The cost of this service may be added to the Mentor Home Arrangement/Specialized Services.

Transition To Adulthood

Transition to Adulthood Services is a community based service available to youth ages 17-21 living in their own community apartment or other settings. Service componen include case management, a life skills assessment, individualized skill training, assistance with education, employment and housing issues and the creation of a transition plan.

ADOPTION SERVICES

(Services are Grant funded, there is no expense to the referring agency or family)

Child Specific Recruitment - For children for whom a permanent plan has not been successfully implemented, child specific recruitment may be utilized. Using the child history, including interviews with the child, their family and other individuals significant in the child's life, an attempt is made to locate a potentially permanent placement for the child. No expense to the referring agency is included until the child is placed. At this point regular rates apply based on Placement Level.

Adoption Preparation

Recruiting families, preparing children and families for adoption and assisting DSS with completing paperwork necessary to finalize adoptions through state grants covering th Roanoke Valley, New River Valley, Abingdon and Lynchburg area.

Post Adoption

Assisting families who have adopted children and reside in the Roanoke, Abingdon, Cedar Bluff, New River Valley, Danville and Lynchburg areas, including the surrounding counties who are in need of intensive support; including case management, therapy, community-based family engagement services, support groups, family respite activities, and VP of Child and Family Service iele-psychiatry.

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
