| As the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) explains, "For those at risk of developing a serious problem with drinking or drugs, the identification of early warning signs can be enough to change negative drinking or drug use habits." Substance Abuse Assessments may provide the visual evidence necessary to change a person's decision about treatment. Essentially, assessments involve a series of questions which help identify warning signs of substance abuse. Some indicators may be frequency of use (i.e. daily, monthly, or yearly) or duration of use (i.e. how long abuse may have occurred). Clinician's Substance Abuse (ASAM) Assessments are in-depth, involving a series of questions which are then scored based on the answers—risk of abuse is then based on the tabulated score. Substance Abuse (ASAM) Assessments involve a person's personal history of substance abuse, health history, family history of substance abuse, age, and may also ask about any current mental health disorders—all of which can contribute to a person's risk of developing a substance use disorder. There are also assessments which may gauge a person's substance abuse over the past 12 months. Certain Substance Abuse ASAM assessments may be geared toward adolescents. The questions involve many of the same questions given to adults, but some are more teen-specific. Examples of questions on an adolescent substance abuse screen may be:

- Have you ever lost friends due to your drug use?
- Have you ever been in trouble at school because of drug use?
- Are you falling behind in school due to drug use?
- Have you been arrested for drug use?
- Have you contacted someone about getting help with treatment?

Behavioral health problems, including substance use and mental health conditions, are more difficult to treat if trauma-related symptoms and disorders are not detected early and treated effectively. Although the high prevalence of significant psychological trauma among clients with serious and persistent mental health challenges is well known, and even where it is duly recorded in initial psychiatric histories, such trauma is rarely reflected in the primary (or secondary) diagnosis. Referrals come primarily from the court system, staff work closely with probation and parole staff and report to the court as needed. Family involvement in the treatment process is strongly encouraged. The program aims at helping children and adolescents and their families identify their strengths and resolve problems or concerns that may have contributed to the offense. The child or adolescent explores their offense(s) and identify their individual cycle of abuse (i.e., the thoughts, feelings, conditions that precede and follow their offenses(s). They also explore how they have denied and minimized the significance of their behavior. They learn the effects of sexual offenses on the victims and some learn how to deal with their own abuse.   |

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

A Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) will conduct sessions in the determined setting multiple times per week with a total number of weekly hours based on the recommendation of the BCBA. Each session will focus on goals from the treatment plan, as well as training parents and caregivers on the implementation of the BIP. The BCBA will continue to supervise the RBT throughout the services with at least one office supervision per week and with on-site supervisions determined by the number of direct hours the RBT is conducting. |



| COURT ORDERED SUPERVISED VISITATION SERVICES: This service is not covered by any Insurance.   |
| Court Ordered Supervised Visitation Services are provided by Licensed Professional Counselors (LPC), Licensed Clinical Social Workers (LCSW), Licensed Marriage Family Therapist (LMFT), or a Resident in Counseling (RIC) under the direct supervision of an LPC, LMFT or LCSW.  |
| Therapeutic Supervised Visitations are typically (not always) court-ordered and allow non-custodial parents or guardians to meet with their children in a safe and controlled environment, with the guidance of a neutral mental health provider, who supervises the visitation and writes a brief report about what took place. Normally, the visitations occur weekly at WCMHC, for a predetermined amount of time. The frequency and duration of these visits are generally decided by a judge, or between attorneys through an agreed order.  |
| The purpose and goal of supervised visitations is to enable an ongoing relationship between the non-custodial parent and chil by impartially observing their contact in a safe and structured environment. We also facilitate and maintain appropriate child/parent interaction during supervised contact and allow the judge to make informed decisions, based on the outcome of these visits. Another purpose of supervised visitations is to allow a safe and educational learning experience for the non-custodial parent. In our WCMHC Therapeutic Supervised Visitation Program, if the parent makes a mistake, the mental health professional can intervene and correct the behavior, therefore teaching the parent correct parenting skills.  |
| Normally high-conflict families who are at risk for domestic violence, physical or verbal abuse, and parents with a history of verpoor parenting skills require the use of therapeutic supervised visitation programs. Those who have previous allegations of sexual abuse, who have threatened to run away with the child, or with a history of severe parental alienation are also generally good candidates for therapeutically supervised visitation in our program.  |
| Our monitors are trained mental health professionals who follow strict guidelines and are comfortable offering guidance to the court, based on their observations. By having mental health professionals supervise visitations, our staff can assist in identifying and attempting to correct any issues that may prevent the parent from having a healthy and productive relationship with their child. Our agency places a large importance on the safety of all parties involved in the visitations, which is another reason we chose mental health professionals who follow strict guidelines to ensure that safety is maintained. As mental health professionals we can recognize poor or dangerous behaviors or acts that may be harmful to the child, and immediately terminate visits if the need arises. |

The therapist keeps the court aware of the therapy and writes a report at its conclusion.   |

|                         |          | Reunification therapy is not client centered, that is, the child or parent does not determine the goals of treatment. Therefore, it is recommended that individual therapists for the child, the reunifying parent and the custodial parent be utilized. Adjunct individual therapy is useful when the custodial parent feels left out of the process and when the child has significant concerns about seeing the reunifying parent. The therapist spends time individually with the child and with the reunifying parent before meeting with both together. Moreover, the therapist acts as a container for the reunifying parent and child to safely address their relationship and contacts the individual therapists as needed to coordinate treatment.   |
|                         |          | Reunification therapy requires a court order from the family court. The court order stipulates the expectations of cooperation by both parents, the court's expectation of treatment goals and interventions, parameters for extended family involvement, provides discretion to the therapist to set arrangements for treatment, payment arrangements for the therapist, and other contingencies. In the event of substance abuse and alcohol issues, allegations of abuse or past domestic violence, the reunification therapy begins the process of safe contact for the child and the estranged parent. All pertinent records and contact with collateral professionals and governing agencies must be available to the reunification therapist. Everyone involved should have clear understanding of the expectations and parameters of reunification therapy before it begins. The reunification therapist's role is to work with the reunifying parent and child. The information is not confidential as he or she will be responsible to report back to the court any significant findings and/or obstacles encountered. |
|                         |          | Reunification Therapy (RT) is a therapeutic intervention for separated families when the children find difficulty visiting with the noncustodial parent, but depending on the circumstances, the purpose and goals of reunification therapy vary. The therapist identifies the factors contributing to the estrangement and by working on communication, trust and probing residual feelings contributing to the estrangement. RT may include an intake assessment of parents and children to develop an appropriate treatment plan and in-office treatment for all family members affected by alienation or high conflict divorce.  |
