




Career Spotlight Market Research Analyst


Career Spotlight Electrician






Career Spotlight Registered Nurse





The cost of a WoW! event is \$45,000. Much of this is afforded by local business sponsorship but over the past four years, our regional Career and Technical Education Administrators have earmarked their Perkins Grant funds to account for the majority of the cost. The Perkins Grant is not guaranteed and must be decided on by our Virginia General Assembly during the budget process.
