Therapeutic Mentoring	Role model support in the social and emotional development of youth. Mentors help adolescents learn to understand and communicate their feelings, to relate appropriately to their peers, and to develop healthy relationships with other adults. This program is designed with outcomes in mind. Dominion implements treatment team goals, collects outcome data, and consistently shares results with the treatment team. Therapeutic Mentoring is designed to provide mentor-youth relationships that exist for at least a year, with meetings of at least five hours per week.	\$60	Hourly	
ABA Behavioral Therapy	Individuals ages 1-21 receive therapy using the principles of Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) to learn new skills, address interfering behaviors and gain independence in their daily lives. All services are developed and supervised by a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) with a highly qualified Behavior Therapist providing the day to day instruction and interventions. This rate includes both direct and indirect services such as, but not limited to, updating data, data analysis, and treatment planning. ABA Early Intervention Services (in Clinic)	Dominion ABA preschool is a specialized program for early childhood children with significant behavioral, social, and communication challenges. This is an in-clinic service that provides year-round therapeutic services to remediate skill deficits and challenging behaviors related to autism, developmental disabilities, multiple disabilities, and related disorders that may benefit from ABA-based curriculum. Preschool classroom will include 1:1 instruction in ABA, parent support, and generalization training in the home.
