SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER OUTPATIENT SERVICES		Unit Rate
<b>Adolescent Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral for Treatment (SBIRT)</b> SBIRT consists of three (3) major components: Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment. A Screening to assess the individual's risk of substance use using Hazelden Betty Ford's "Teen Intervene" Screening Tool, conducted by a licensed professional, licensed Resident or Supervisee under the direct supervision of a licensed professional, or a Certified Substance Abuse Counselor (CSAC). The screening includes the following instruments: Alcohol Use Disorders Identification Test (AUDIT), CRAFFT, Tobacco and Other Drugs Questionnaire. A Brief Intervention engaging the individual in conversation, showing risky behaviors, providing feedback and advice. A Referral for Treatment to individuals who screen in need of additional services. (Approximately 1 hr.)		\$125 per screening
<b>Substance Use Disorder Assessment (Full ASAM Assessment)</b> 90791 A biopsychosocial, multidimensional Substance Use Disorder Assessment based on the ASAM Criteria conducted by a licensed professional to ascertain an individual's level of care needs for treatment of their substance use. The individual receives the assessment and the Substance Abuse Subtle Screening Inventory (SASSI), an evidence-based screening instrument. Diagnosis and treatment recommendations are determined as a result of the assessment. (Approximately 2 hrs.)		\$250 per assessment
<b>Individual Substance Use Disorder Therapy (ASAM Level 1)</b> 90832 (30 min); 90834 (45 min); 90837 (60 min) Individual substance use disorder therapy with a licensed professional as determined to meet individualized needs based on the Substance Use Disorder Assessment. A licensed professional will develop an individualized treatment plan with the client. Sessions will typically be 60 minutes and the number of sessions will be dependent on the client's needs and progress.		\$135.00 60 min

<b>Family Substance Use Disorder Therapy (ASAM Level 1)</b> 90846 – Family w/client; 90847 – Family w/o client Family substance use disorder therapy with a licensed professional as determined to meet ISP goals established with the individual.		\$135 50 min
<b>Group Substance Use Disorder Therapy (ASAM Level 1)</b> 90853 Group substance use disorder therapy will be provided by a licensed professional. Goals established individually with the client for their ISP will be addressed in a group setting. Groups will have no more than 10 individuals at a time.		\$60 per session
<b>Adolescent Substance Use Disorder Group Therapy</b> Group therapy provided by a licensed therapist or a licensed Resident or Supervisee under the direct supervision of a licensed therapist. Goals established individually with the client for their ISP will be addressed in a group setting. An evidence-based curriculum from Hazelden Betty Ford "Living in Balance" is utilized and consists of ten (10) one-hour (1.hr.) weekly sessions. There is an expectation of parent/legal guardian participation during several sessions for adolescents. Groups will have no more than 15 individuals at a time.		\$60 per session

<p><b><i>Substance Use Disorder Intensive Outpatient Services (ASAM Level 2.1)</i></b>  H0015  Intensive Outpatient Services for Adults (21+) or Adolescents (12-20 years old) with substance use disorders and/or co-occurring mental health disorders whose assessed Substance Use Disorder treatment needs fall within the ASAM Level 2.1 continuum of care. This service is provided to individuals who do not require the intensive level of care of inpatient, residential or partial hospitalization services, but require more intensive services than the weekly or bi-weekly sessions of traditional outpatient services. Adults receive a minimum of 9 hours per week (3, 3-hour sessions) and Adolescents receive a minimum of 6 hours per week (2, 3-hour sessions) of Substance Use Disorder treatment. Includes individual, group and family therapy, psychoeducational group sessions, referral and collaboration with other treatment and medication management providers, and treatment for co-occurring mental health disorders.</p>	\$250 per day
<p><b><i>Peer Support Services, Individual</i></b>  T1012  Peer Support Services for adults is an evidence-based, recovery oriented rehabilitative service for individuals 21 years or older provided by a certified Peer Recovery Specialist (PRS). A PRS is an individual with lived experience with substance use or co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders who has been successful in the recovery process. Specific Peer Support Service activities promote empowerment, self-determination, and understanding through mentoring, service coordination, and teaching positive coping skills to use when facing the unique stressors and barriers encountered by individuals in recovery.</p>	\$30 per hour
<p><b><i>Peer Support Services, Group</i></b>  S9445  Peer Support Services for adults facilitated by a certified Peer Recovery Specialist or cofacilitated by a PRS and CSAC or LMHP. This service can assist individuals with self-determination strategies utilizing a group setting.</p>	\$20 per session
<p><b><i>Adolescent Substance Use Disorder Prevention &amp; Education Group</i></b>  Psychoeducational groups for Adolescents (12-20) conducted by a licensed professional, licensed Resident or Supervisee under the direct supervision of a licensed professional, or a Certified Substance Abuse Counselor (CSAC). The group will be topic driven based on the needs identified for the clients on their ISPs. Topics will range from enhancing coping skills, relationships and codependence, stages of change, learning about individual substances and their effect on the brain and body, to issues likely in early recovery, and ultimately relapse prevention. The Adolescent Group will utilize an evidenced-based curriculum from Hazelden Betty Ford "Teen Intervene" and consist of ten (10) one-hour (1 hr.) weekly sessions. There is an expectation of parent/legal guardian participation during at least one session for adolescents. A certificate of completion is awarded to participants who complete the program.</p>	\$40 per session
<b>OUTPATIENT SERVICES</b>	
<p><b><i>Mental Health Evaluation</i></b>  A Mental Health Evaluation (MHE) is used to ascertain whether or not an individual is functioning on a healthy social, emotional, and behavioral level, and to diagnose potential mental health disorders. The MHE includes a biopsychosocial assessment and the following assessment tools: Psychological Screening Inventory (PSI-2), Beck Depression Inventory, and Beck Anxiety Inventory. Diagnosis and treatment recommendations are provided. The MHE is conducted by a licensed therapist, or a licensed Resident or Supervisee under the direct supervision of a licensed therapist. (Approximately 2 hrs.)</p>	\$250 per evaluation
<p><b><i>Diagnostic Evaluation</i></b>  90791  Initial evaluation and clinical assessment of treatment needs for mental health outpatient therapy services for individuals and/or families by a licensed therapist, or a Resident or Supervisee under the direct supervision of a licensed therapist. This evaluation is the first outpatient therapy appointment. (Approximately 90 minutes)</p>	\$150.00 per evaluation
<p><b><i>Individual Therapy</i></b>  90832 (30 min); 90834 (45 min); 90837 (60 min)  Individual mental health outpatient therapy with the individual by a licensed therapist or a licensed Resident or Supervisee under the direct supervision of a licensed therapist. These services may be provided via Telehealth when clinically appropriate as determined by the treating therapist, and as covered by the individual's insurance plan.</p>	\$135.00 60 min

<b>Family/Couples Therapy</b> 90846 – Family w/client; 90847 – Family w/o client Outpatient therapy with the family (or spouse), with or without the individual, by a licensed therapist or a licensed Resident or Supervisee under the direct supervision of a licensed therapist.	\$135.00 50 min
<b>Group Therapy</b> 90853 Group therapy will be provided by a licensed therapist or a licensed Resident or Supervisee under the direct supervision of a licensed therapist. Goals established individually with the client for their ISP will be addressed in a group setting. Groups will have no more than 10 individuals at a time.	\$60 per session
