ABA Behavioral Therapy	Individuals ages 1-21 receive therapy using the principles of Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) to learn new skills, address interfering behaviors and gain independence in their daily lives. All services are developed and supervised by a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) with a highly qualified Behavior Therapist providing the day-to-day instruction and interventions. This rate includes both direct and indirect services such as, but not limited to, updating data, data analysis, and treatment planning. Dominion ABA provides the following ABA Behavioral Therapy services: communication intervention; social skills intervention; reduction of interfering behaviors through the instruction of coping skills and safe alternative behaviors; community-based instruction; and family education and support.	\$186.52	Hourly

Parenting Capacity and Psychological Evaluation	Individual evaluation about the parent that provides results about the quality of an adult's early relationship history, current patterns of thinking and feeling about attachment relationships, and evidence about the degree of healing of the effects of relationship conflict, losses, rejection, injury, neglect, or abuse they may have experienced. This evaluation provides results about the parent's abilities to reflect upon the child's emotions and behavior, as well as the impact of the parent's emotions and behavior on the child. Psychological testing about the parent includes assessment of a parent's cognitive and psychiatric functioning to assist in helping to determine what is in a child's best interest.
