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Journey House Foundation is a registered 501(c)(3) committed to providing a complete recovery support system of care, by blending recovery and mental health support, while providing affordable, quality VARR accredited housing environments to those seeking long-term recovery from substance use disorder. We help our participants learn a new way of life in recovery, by using community collaboration, peer to peer delivery methods, and real-life experiences outside of their recovery network.

**The following Services are included in the comprehensive Daily Rate:**

- Life Skills Training and Coaching
- Completion of Casey Life Skills Assessment (annually)
- Formulation of Transitional Living Service Plan
- Formulating of Monthly Reports and Quarterly Service Plan Updates
- Guide and supervise the use of Recovery Capital through the Advance Recovery at Arms system for Self-Assessment for support service goal planning and participant engagement
- Coordination of Medical Service compliance and supervision of medication
- Coordination of Therapeutic Services



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- 3-5 community engagement activities (including, nature walks, local gyms, service work, among others)
- 2 signification reactionary activities monthly (such as going to the river, a local amusement park, athletic games or fireworks)
- Assistance with education service, employment and daily living activities
- Coordination of resources for groceries, clothing, and incidentals
- Meal planning and group meals
- Transportation to school, religious activities, medical needs and daytime 12 step recovery meetings
