
Overview of the Children's Services Act (CSA) and Budget Request

- Enacted in 1993 by the Virginia General Assembly
- Provides funding for high-risk children and their families
- Ensures services are child-centered, family-focused, and community-based
- Most youth eligible for services through CSAqualify under a "sum sufficient" category, which mandates funding to meet their assessed needs without a predefined cap

Who Does CSA Serve?

- Youth in foster care or juvenile justice
- Children with serious emotional or behavioral challenges
- At-risk children needing intervention to prevent foster care
- Students receiving Special Education services through private placement according to an IEP.

Why a Budget Increase is Needed (Overview)



16.91% Increase Requested: \$468,199.22



Key Drivers of the Increase:

Rising number of children in foster care
Increased mental health needs
Higher costs of specialized care and inflation

Statewide and Local Trends Supporting the Increase

• Statewide Data:

- 6% increase in youth served statewide (FY23-FY24)
- \$542 million spent statewide, reflecting a 15% budget increase

• Local Data:

- Youth served in congregate care settings increased from 8.33% to 17.58% this year, which carries the highest local match rate among all services.
- FY23 served 20 private day school students; FY24 served 19, but costs rose by \$115,201

Policy Impacts Driving Expenditure Increases





Reimbursement Limitations:

Budget Bill proposes limiting reimbursement to localities to 2.5% over prior year rates, requiring additional local funds to cover rate increases

Legislative Changes:

Proposed bill may alter eligibility criteria, adding separate eligibility for youth with CHINServices
