

Private Foster Care	Service Rate
<p><b>TFC Assessment Level:</b> Upon admission to People Places all children/youth will enter at the Assessment level for a period not to exceed 60 days. A needs assessment and service plan will be completed based on all available information, documentation, observations and in collaboration with the LDSS, FAPT, foster family, birth family, and any other involved service providers. LDSS will complete the CANS and VEMAT during this period, and a Family Partnership Meeting may be held. A consensus will be reached collaboratively with a recommendation of the appropriate level of care for the specific needs of the youth. A minimum of two home visits per month or more as dictated by the needs of the youth, will be provided. 24/7 crisis intervention and support for the youth and foster family is provided. <i>This level of care requires TFC Case Management services which is a separate service fee and is not incorporated into the fee for this level of care. The preferred funding source for TFC Case Management is DMAS. When a client is eligible, \$367.31/month will be billed to Medicaid; when ineligible \$367.31/month will be billed to FAPT.</i></p>	<p>\$170/day + \$367.31/month</p>
<p><b>Non-Treatment Level:</b> A supportive level of service offered to foster parents to provide a structured and supportive setting to youth who are placed who have been assessed and do not present with treatment needs. This is intended as a lower level of support, while still maintaining quality foster care service, support, and supervision until a more permanent goal is achieved. These children should be developmentally on target, demonstrate age appropriate behaviors, participate in community activities without restriction, have no active diagnoses, and have minimal life domain/emotional/behavior needs, or be the sibling of a child who meets the criteria for TFC placement in the same home. This service will provide a lower level of contact than a TFC case, to include a minimum of one home visit per month and will include 24/7 crisis intervention as needed.</p>	<p>\$105/day</p>
<p><b>TFC Level 1:</b> Core Treatment Foster Care services provided to children with a mild level of social, emotional, behavioral, medical, personal care needs or impairment for normal range of age and development; such as, but not limited to depression, anxiety, impulsivity, hyperactivity, anger control, adjustment to trauma, oppositional, substance use, eating disorder, physical health condition, developmental delay, or intellectual. Identification of IL goals for youth 14 and older and assistance to youth 16 and older with preparation for the transition from foster care to adulthood is included in this service. The youth's needs require monitoring or may require provision of services to decrease the likelihood that the needs will re-emerge. . A minimum of one home visit per month and one face-to-face contact will be provided. 24/7 crisis intervention and support for the youth and foster family is provided. A youth may be stepped down to Level 1 upon achievement of permanency if behaviors have stabilized over a period of time. Step-down decisions are made with the treatment team in relation to permanency and stability. <i>This level of care requires TFC Case Management services which is a separate service fee and is not incorporated into the fee for this level of care. The preferred funding source for TFC Case Management is DMAS. When a client is eligible, \$367.31/month will be billed to Medicaid; when ineligible \$367.31/month will be billed to FAPT.</i></p>	<p>\$148/day + \$367.31/month</p>
<p><b>TFC Level 2:</b> Core Treatment Foster Care services provided to children with a moderate level of social, emotional, behavioral, medical, personal care needs or impairment for normal range of age and development; such as, but not limited to depression, anxiety, impulsivity, hyperactivity, anger control, adjustment to trauma, oppositional, substance use, eating disorder, physical health condition, developmental delay or intellectual. Identification of IL goals for youth 14 and older and assistance to youth 16 and older with preparation for the transition from foster care to adulthood is included in this service. The youth's needs require that action, interventions, services or supports be provided to address or remedy the needs. These services and available resources support and foster the placement, and include, but are not limited to, additional visitation or reunification work, case aide duties, and groups.. A minimum of two home visits per month or more as dictated by the needs of the youth will be provided.. 24/7 crisis intervention and support for the youth and foster family is provided. <i>This level of care requires TFC Case Management services which is a separate service fee and is not incorporated into the fee for this level of care. The preferred funding source for TFC Case Management is DMAS. When a client is eligible, \$367.31/month will be billed to Medicaid; when ineligible \$367.31/month will be billed to FAPT.</i></p>	<p>\$170/day + \$367.31/month</p>

<p><b>TFC Level 3:</b> Core Treatment Foster Care services provided to children who demonstrate a significant or severe level of social/emotional/behavioral/medical/personal care needs or impairment for normal range of age and development; such as, but not limited to depression, anxiety, impulsivity, hyperactivity, anger control, adjustment to trauma, oppositional, substance use, eating disorder, physical health condition, developmental delay, or intellectual. Identification of IL goals for youth 14 and older and assistance to youth 16 and older with preparation for the transition from foster care to adulthood is included in this service. The youth's needs are of such severity that they require intensive action, intervention, services, or supports to address or remedy the needs. A youth served at this level may be at risk for residential placement. These services and available resources support and foster the placement, and include, but are not limited to, additional visitation or reunification work, case aide duties, groups, and family-focused attachment and trauma work if the placement is at risk of disruption or the need exists for a higher level of care. 24/7 crisis intervention and support for the youth and foster family is provided. A minimum of two home visits per month or more as dictated by the needs of the youth will be provided. <i>This level of care requires TFC Case Management services which is a separate service fee and is not incorporated into the fee for this level of care. The preferred funding source for TFC Case Management is DMAS. When a client is eligible, \$367.31/month will be billed to Medicaid; when ineligible \$367.31 will be billed to FAPT.</i></p>	<p>\$190/day + \$367.31/month</p>
<p><b>TFC-Case Management: Medicaid:</b> This DMAS defined service is a required component of TFC that focuses on continuity of services that are goal directed and results-oriented, and case management includes gaining access to needed medical, social, educational and other identified services developed in the individual treatment plan. It covers assessment, planning, referral and monitoring of services. It does not cover direct delivery of services, recruitment and approval of foster parents, their training, staff training, client placement, foster parent support, supervision and other service components of TFC. This service is combined with the appropriate level of Private Foster Care Support, Supervision and Administration-Supervision &amp; Support described above. <i>The preferred funding source for TFC Case Management is DMAS. When a client is eligible/approved by DMAS, this fee will be billed to Medicaid;</i></p>	<p>\$367.31/month</p>
<p><b>TFC-Case Management: FAPT:</b> This DMAS defined service is a required component of TFC that focuses on continuity of services that are goal directed and results-oriented, and case management includes gaining access to needed medical, social, educational and other identified services developed in the individual treatment plan. It covers assessment, planning, referral and monitoring of services. It does not cover direct delivery of services, recruitment and approval of foster parents, their training, staff training, client placement, foster parent support, supervision and other service components of TFC. This service is combined with the appropriate level of Private Foster Care Support, Supervision and Administration-Supervision &amp; Support described above. <i>The preferred funding source for TFC Case Management is DMAS. If client does not meet medical necessity criteria for DMAS funding, this fee will be the responsibility of the locality.</i></p>	<p>\$367.31/month</p>
<p><b>Supervised Visits:</b> Supervision of additional or excessive family visitation between foster child and family members. Hourly billing based on the amount of staff time involved when there is a need for a more rigorous visitation schedule.</p>	<p>\$67.50/hour</p>
<p><b>Clinical Visits:</b> Supervision of family visitation between foster child and family members where the supervision requires observation, documentation, and possibility of court testimony by a qualified staff.</p>	<p>\$83/hour</p>
<p><b>Family Support Service PostAdoption Level 1:</b> This level of support and case management assistance provides work with a family who has adopted a special needs child, in order to prevent dissolution or placement outside of the adoptive home. It is intended for children or youth who have experienced complex-developmental trauma. On-call is provided, but respite nights are not part of this service.</p>	<p>\$148/day</p>
<p><b>Family Support Service PostAdoption Level 2:</b> This level of support and case management assistance provides more intensive work with a family who has adopted a special needs child, in order to prevent dissolution or placement outside of the adoptive home. It is intended for children or youth who have experienced significant complex-developmental trauma. On-call is provided, but respite nights are not part of this service. This level may be at risk of disruption.</p>	<p>\$170/day</p>

<p><b>Family Support Service PostAdoption Level 3:</b> This level of support and case management assistance provides the most intensive work with a family who has adopted a special needs child, in order to prevent dissolution or placement outside of the adoptive home. It is intended for children or youth who have experienced significant complex-developmental trauma. On-call is provided, but respite nights are not part of this service. This level may be at risk of disruption.</p>	\$190/day
<p><b>Therapeutic Youth Mentoring:</b> Provides personalized, structured support for children and teens, helping them explore meaningful community experiences. Through these outings, participants gain increased self-confidence, stronger relationships, and enhanced aspirations for their future, all while learning through natural teaching opportunities and role modeling. Youth mentors work closely with all relevant parties to set and achieve goals tailored to each youth's individual needs. Common focus areas including building resilience, developing age-appropriate behaviors, enhancing problem-solving abilities, and improving communication skills. Youth mentors play a pivotal role in setting the stage for a healthy, successful future, prioritizing the development of a safe and trusting relationship to support each youth's progress toward their goals.</p>	\$65/hour
<p><b>Therapeutic Groups:</b> People Places Inc. offers clinical and psychoeducational groups which are designed to utilize the group process to support clients in healing from trauma and learning skills which will serve them in developing and maintaining significant relationships. Clients are assessed and assigned to groups based on individual needs. Groups provide a safe space for clients to process and work through their own unique struggles with others who have had similar life experiences.</p>	\$46/hour
<p><b>Transportation:</b> Transportation to support attainment of the goals in a child's service plan, either through contracted services, hourly rate and payment of mileage. Services may be designed to enable a child or family member to attend counseling, parenting classes, court, visitation with family members, or other appointments.</p>	\$47/hour plus .70/mile (IRS rate)
<p><b>Outpatient Services: Individual Counseling:</b> provided or supervised by licensed counselor/therapist/social worker including work related specifically to trauma and attachment.</p>	medicaid rate
<p><b>Outpatient Services Family Counseling:</b> Family therapy provided or supervised by licensed counselor/therapist/social worker to include relationship-focused psychotherapy for family members in which the adults with whom the child resides are present and active in the treatment. Therapy focuses on parent training with goals of emotional development and related repair, for children with complex trauma/neglect or with attachment disorganization.</p>	medicaid rate
<b>Community Based Services:</b>	<b>Service Rate</b>
<p><b>Family Mentoring:</b> Supports families, children, and youth at risk of out-of-home placement or transitioning back into the home setting. This service emphasizes trauma-informed support for primary household caregivers. Through individualized mentoring, parenting education and guided access to community resources, we help families strengthen their relationships, enhance daily functioning, and promote long-term stability. The program focuses on reducing parental stress and family dysfunction while nurturing healthy, lasting bonds. Family mentors partner with key stakeholders to establish and pursue goals customized to each family's specific needs. Areas of focus often include developing self-sufficiency, improving social skills, financial management, anger management, academic and career guidance, and connecting with community resources. These services are designed to strengthen family unity and provide the support necessary to create enduring, positive change for both children and caregivers.</p>	\$78/hour

**Kinship Support:** Provides goal-oriented, targeted support and personalized, weekly education to kinship caregivers. This service aims to set specific goals to strengthen family placements through skill development, creating effective parenting strategies tailored to the child's needs, and addressing complex family dynamics and evolving roles. Service plans are developed in collaboration with the family and service worker to provide tailored support for the unique challenges kinship caregivers face when welcoming a relative child into their home. Kinship support is designed as a short-term transitional service. Kinship Support Specialists will work closely with the caregiver to offer education on the impacts of trauma, healthy child development and effective discipline and guidance strategies. The program focuses on stabilizing the placement during the transitional period, fostering safety, permanency, and overall well-being for both the child and the family.

**Non TFC Supplemental Supervision Service:** A staff member from People Places, with support from a Department of Social Services staff member, offers supervision services as needed for a child residing in DSS offices. This non-clinical service focuses on ensuring a safe environment and providing age-appropriate activities for the child.

**IL Service: Mentoring:** A non-placement service which provides skilled mentors specializing in the support of young adults currently residing in independent living arrangements/situations in the community.

**Therapeutic Youth Mentoring:** Provides personalized, structured support for children and teens, helping them explore meaningful community experiences. Through these outings, participants gain increased self-confidence, stronger relationships, and enhanced aspirations for their future, all while learning through natural teaching opportunities and role modeling. Youth mentors work closely with all relevant parties to set and achieve goals tailored to each youth's individual needs. **Individualized Support Case Conferencing:** Service to be used in conjunction with services and delivered at the request of referral agent and others as appropriate.
