  - Personality/MSE assessments include structured clinical interviews and mental status examination and other measures tailored to client needs, for example, behavioral and symptomatic questionnaire and



assessments based on clinical presentation may include, but are not limited to use of tools such as Behavioral and Emotional Rating Scale (BERS-2), Casey Life Skills Assessment, Youth Resiliency Checklist, Strengths and Needs Assessment (SNA), Severity Measure for Generalized Anxiety Disorder, Affective Reactivity Index, Beck Depression Inventory, as well as projective techniques such as Rorschach Inkblots, Incomplete Sentences, and personality testing (MMPI-Adolescent)

- Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule-Second Edition (ADOS-2) is an activity-based assessment administered by trained clinicians to evaluate communication skills, social interaction, and imaginative use of materials in individuals who are suspected to have autism spectrum disorder

## Service Descriptions


### **Therapeutic Teaching Parent Payment: (Enhanced Maintenance Payment – Per VEMAT) -**

Enhanced Maintenance Payment is the source of the payment to foster/adoptive parents for the extra supervision involved in their work with children/adolescents who have medical, emotional, or physical health needs as defined by the Virginia Enhanced Maintenance Assessment Tool (VEMAT).

**Private Foster Care Support Supervision and Administration- Level 3 Intensive** - The needs of a child/adolescent served at level 3 on-going treatment foster care are of such acuity or severity that they require intensive action (interventions, services, supports etc.) be taken to address, remedy or ameliorate the needs. Without such intervention(s) the child may be at risk of residential placement. Children/adolescents served at level 3 will demonstrate a high level of social, emotional, behavioral, medical, and/or personal care needs or impairment for a normal range of age and development. Areas of need may include but not be limited to: depression, anxiety, impulsivity, hyperactivity, anger control, adjustment to trauma, oppositional, substance abuse, eating disorder, physical health condition, developmental delay, serious or life-threatening illnesses or conditions that require the routine use of a medical device, and / or daily ongoing care/monitoring, or intellectually disabled. Every month respectively, Intercept Health Staff will provide at least four (4) face to face visits with the child/adolescent, two (2) of which are conducted in the treatment foster/adoptive home.

**Private Foster Care Support Supervision and Administration - Level 2 Intermediate** - The needs of a child/adolescent served at level 2 on-going treatment foster care require significant action (interventions, services, supports, etc.) be taken to address, remedy or ameliorate the identified needs. Children/adolescents served at level 2 will typically demonstrate relatively moderate levels of social, emotional, behavioral, medical, and/or personal care needs or impairment for normal range of age and development. Areas of need may include but not be limited to: depression, anxiety, impulsivity, hyperactivity, anger control, adjustment to trauma, oppositional, substance abuse, eating disorder, physical health condition, developmental delay, serious or life-threatening illnesses or conditions that require the routine use of a medical device, and / or daily ongoing care/monitoring or, intellectually disabled. Every month respectively, Intercept Health Staff will provide at least three (3) face-to-face visits with the child/adolescent, one (1) of which is conducted in the treatment foster/adoptive home.

**Private Foster Care Support Supervision and Administration- Level 1 Therapeutic** - The needs of a child/adolescent served at level 1 on-going treatment foster care require monitoring or the LCPA may need to provide services to lessen the likelihood that identified needs will become more acute or return after being “resolved”. Children/adolescents served at level 1 will typically demonstrate a relatively low level of social, emotional, behavioral, medical, and/or personal care needs or



impairment for a normal range of age and development. Areas of need may include but not be limited to: depression, anxiety, impulsivity, hyperactivity, anger control, adjustment to trauma, oppositional, substance abuse, eating disorder, physical health condition, developmental delay, serious or life-threatening illnesses or conditions that require the routine use of a medical device, and / or daily ongoing care/monitoring or intellectually disabled. Every month respectively, Intercept Health Staff will provide at least two (2) face to face visits with the child/adolescent, one (1) of which is conducted in the treatment foster/adoptive home.

**Assessment Treatment Level** – Children/Adolescents served at the assessment level of treatment foster care are newly placed with the LCPA and still require an assessment to determine the appropriate level of treatment foster care services needed. The maximum stay at the Assessment Treatment Level shall not exceed sixty (60) days, while a needs assessment and service plan are completed, per the requirements of VDSS’ Division of Licensing Programs. The time frame of the assessment may vary, based on what is needed to complete an accurate and thorough assessment of the child/adolescent’s strengths and needs.


**Non-Treatment Foster Care** – Children/Adolescents served at the non-treatment level of foster care may be developmentally on target, demonstrate age-appropriate behaviors, able to participate in community activities without restriction, or be the sibling of a child who meets the criteria for on-going TFC placement in the same foster/adoptive home. Children/Adolescents shall be served at the non-treatment level if the assessment indicates treatment foster care services are not needed. Children/adolescents placed on the non-treatment level are not expected to meet DMAS criteria; this service includes a maximum of one (1) face to face visit with the youth in the treatment foster home and (1) face to face visit every 60 days conducted by Intercept Health Staff. This contact per month includes 24/7 crisis intervention.

**\*Note: All TFC-Support & Supervision Levels may have additional support services that assist in the implementation of the child/adolescent’s treatment goals/objectives and/or permanency goal/discharge plan.**

**Treatment Foster Care Case Management** – This service, per DMAS, is designed to assist children/adolescents who are receiving treatment foster care with gaining access to needed medical, social, educational, and other necessary services. It covers assessment, planning, referral and monitoring of services. It does not cover direct delivery of services, recruitment and approval of foster/adoptive parents, their training, staff training, client placement, foster/adoptive parent support, supervision and other service components of TFC. This service is combined with the appropriate level of TFC-Supervision & Support described above. This service may or may not be covered by Medicaid depending upon the eligibility of the child. It is billed at a daily rate when paid through CSA.

**\*Additional Note: There is no charge for non-treatment level case management. In addition, if Medicaid determines the child does not meet medical necessity criteria and denies Treatment Foster Care Case Management, CSA may pay for case management based on justification of need. In all cases, Provider must obtain FAPT/CPMT prior approval.**

**Infant Rate/Support Service** - This rate covers coordination of and services for infants who remain in the custody of a Foster Care client. This is an additional service that can be contracted on a case-by-case basis. Services for the infant will be monitored through the relationship with the Foster Care client when placed together. The Basic Maintenance for the infant is added to the client’s charges. For infants who are in the custody of social services and placed in an Intercept Health home, all individual foster care rates apply for infant.



**Overnight Pre-Placement Visit** - There is no charge for daytime or overnight pre-placement visits. The visits are intended to ensure proper placement and adjustment of child and family prior to formal placement. Mileage and travel expense reimbursement can be agreed upon for unique situations in advance of pre-placement visits on a case-by-case basis.

**Short-term Foster Care Services** - This service is designed to provide crisis or alternate planned support relief for up to 29 consecutive calendar days to families in need of substitute care placement arrangements for children/adolescents. The substitute care placement environments used are approved Intercept Health foster/adoptive homes. Short-term overnight care:

- Level 1: Overnight respite care for children with behavioral issues requiring minimal to no intervention.
- Level 2: Overnight respite care for children with behavioral issues requiring major interventions.

**Respite Services** - This is a temporary, internal support service provided to approved Intercept Health foster/adoptive families, for which Intercept Health Staff arrange on their behalf with other internal Intercept Health foster/adoptive homes by reviewing respite care options and by the matching children with respite caregivers. Respite Services provide valuable support and relief to the primary treatment foster/adoptive families while ensuring the health and safety of the child/adolescent and families. Use of respite is also a healthy mechanism to enhance attachments for children/adolescent with their caregivers. This service can also provide emergency relief to internal Intercept Health families in crisis situations. An accrual system is utilized with Intercept Health foster/adoptive families. This service can be contracted to allow for additional respite services for children/adolescents on a case-by-case basis when the child/adolescent has exceptional needs.

**Therapeutic Aide (school-based)**- A personalized and one-to-one service, focusing on the specific needs of each child/adolescent by closely working with educators to identify and address behaviors impacting social, emotional, and academic performance. Our TAs, trained as Registered Behavior Technicians, use technology to gather real-time data, that help to support and ensure sensitive and effective interventions. We emphasize transparent communication with regular updates and active participation in IEP and team meetings to foster collaboration. Therapeutic Aides are committed to nurturing inclusive, supportive educational environments for enhanced outcomes.

**Therapeutic Aide (community-based)**- A personalized and one-to-one service, offered to children/adolescents through implementation of behavior principles that increase use of coping and pro-social skills. These services can be provided in a home or community. These services can also be provided for emergency situations or with short notice to provide adequate, trauma-informed, supervision of individuals in a hospital, home, social services, or community.

**Transportation** - Transportation services provided by drivers trained in trauma-informed care and behavioral de-escalation, which provides a non-intrusive approach for children/adolescents with aggressive behaviors. Local transportation can be provided for any type of situation within a 20-mile range. Distant cases are over 20 miles with out-of-state transportation available. Therapeutic Aide(s) may be used when additional support is needed during distant trips.

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## Service Descriptions


**Intensive In-Home Services** - Services for children/adolescents under the age of 21. Services are intensive, time-limited interventions provided typically but not solely in the residence of a child who is at-risk of being moved into an out of home placement or who is being transitioned to the home from an out of home placement due to documented clinical needs of the child. These services provide crisis treatment, individual and family counseling on topics such as communication, problem-solving, anger management, and interpersonal interactions, and coordination with other necessary services. Services also include 24-hour emergency response.

**Mental Health Skill-Building Service** - A training service for individuals, over the age of 18, with significant psychiatric functional limitations. Services are designed to train individuals in functions skills and appropriate behavior related to the individual’s health and safety, activities of daily living and use of community resources, assistance with medication management and monitoring health, nutrition and physical condition. These services are intended to enable individual with significant mental illness to achieve and maintain community stability and independence in the most appropriate, least restrictive environment.

**Supportive In-home Services** – Structured interventions to enhance individual skills and support families. This service provides skill-building activities, aiding in coping, problem-solving, and emotional regulation and fosters a supportive living environment by assisting with organization and routines.

**Raising Our Children (ROC) – A Home-Based Parenting Service** is a prevention service that empowers caretakers with the knowledge and tools necessary to parent effectively and with confidence while maintaining a healthy, nurturing relationship with their child. It focuses on six core areas including nurturing and attachment; childcare and safety; health and nutrition; child growth and development; positive discipline; and parental and family resilience. During home-based sessions, parenting specialists provide remedial review of curriculum information, model parenting skills, role-play parenting techniques with the caretaker, facilitate opportunities for caretakers to begin practicing healthy parenting strategies within their parent-child relationship, and tailor their intervention to meet the unique needs of each caretaker. ROC promotes a healthy parent-child relationship and utilizes the Nurturing Parenting Curriculum, an evidence-based program. This service additionally offers supervised visitation, prioritizing child safety and positive interactions.

**Mobile Crisis** – Short-term, direct mental health care to address the immediate needs of clients experiencing acute psychiatric symptoms or behavioral symptoms that place their home, school, or program placement at risk. The goals are to avert hospitalization or re-hospitalization; provide normative environments with a high assurance of safety; stabilize the individual’s home, school, or program placement; and mobilize both referrals for necessary treatment post discharge as well as resources through natural supports. While admitted to the program, individuals will participate in crisis/safety planning, treatment planning, individual and family counseling, and symptom and behavior management. Staff utilize a trauma-informed care approach.



**Community Crisis Stabilization** - Short-term, direct mental health care to non-hospitalized individuals who recently experienced acute psychiatric symptoms or behavioral symptoms that place their home, school, or program placement at risk. The goals are to avert hospitalization or re-hospitalization; provide normative environments with a high assurance of safety; stabilize the individual's home, school, or program placement; and mobilize both referrals for necessary treatment post discharge as well as resources through natural supports. While admitted to the program, individuals will participate in crisis/safety planning, treatment planning, individual and family counseling, and symptom and behavior management. Staff utilize a trauma-informed care approach.

**Mental Health Intensive Outpatient Program for Children and Adolescents** - An intensive program designed to assist children and adolescents (ages 6-17) with increasing their coping and social skills to promote behavior change within their natural environment. The program's goal is to improve the youth's overall functioning and prevent the need for a higher level of care. The program also offers crisis intervention, addresses co-occurring disorders, and includes family and natural supports as able. The program utilizes evidenced-based practices and a minimum of 2 hours per day of either Group Counseling, Individual Counseling, Family Counseling, Medication Management, and/or Care Coordination to achieve this goal. The youth must be able to participate in at least 3 group counseling sessions per week as part of the program.

**Mental Health Intensive Outpatient Program for Adults** - An intensive program designed to assist individuals, ages 18+, with increasing coping and relationship skills to promote healthier relationships and stress management. The program's goal is to improve the individual's overall functioning and prevent the need for a higher level of care. The program offers crisis intervention, addresses co-occurring disorders, and includes family or significant others as applicable. The program utilizes evidenced-based practices and a minimum of 3 hours per day of either Group Counseling, Individual Counseling, Family Counseling, Medication Management, and/or Care Coordination to achieve this goal. The individual must be able to participate in at least 3 group counseling sessions per week as part of the program.

**Therapeutic Aide (school-based)**– A personalized and one-to-one service, focusing on the specific needs of each student by closely working with educators to identify and address behaviors impacting social, emotional, and academic performance. Our TAs, trained as Registered Behavior Technicians, use technology to gather real-time data, that help to support and ensure sensitive and effective interventions. We emphasize transparent communication with regular updates and active participation in IEP and team meetings to foster collaboration. Therapeutic Aides are committed to nurturing inclusive, supportive educational environments for enhanced outcomes.

**Therapeutic Aide (community-based)**– A personalized and one-to-one service, offered to individuals through implementation of behavior principles that increase use of coping and pro-social skills. These services can be provided in a home or community. **Center-Based Applied Behavioral Analysis Services

Intercept Health’s Center-Based Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) services provide behavior consultation and therapy for children and adolescents with spectrum disorders, intellectual or developmental disabilities, or disruptive behaviors. Intercept Health’s ABA services focus on five core areas: significant behaviors, sensory integration, communication deficits, social interactions, and ritualized or repetitive behaviors. Our children and adolescents benefit from social interaction and individualized 1:1 treatment in a supportive environment.

### Service Descriptions

**Initial Behavior Assessment / Behavior Re-Assessment** – An assessment completed by either a BCBA or BCaBA that includes assessing the client’s behavioral needs through observation, parent/caregiver interviews, and initial intake paperwork. The assessment is used to create a treatment plan. The re-assessment is used to determine continued need and update the treatment plan.

**Direct ABA Services** – Services provided 1:1 by a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA), Board-Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA), or a Register Behavior Technician (RBT) to work on the goals identified in the treatment plan and to address the five core areas of our program. Care coordination, collaborating with any additional agencies providing services for the client, is also included as part of the 1:1 services to ensure the services are working cohesively towards the client’s goals.

**Group ABA Services** – Services provided in a group setting by either a BCBA, BCaBA, or RBT to work on social interaction and functional communication within peer groups.

**Supervision, Program Development, or Parent Training** – Oversight, by a BCBA or BCaBA, of the utilization of the treatment plan and the direct care staff who are providing services for the client. This includes reviewing and updating the treatment plan as needed, as well as providing parent training to assist with implementing ABA interventions within the home environment.

**Group Parent Training** – Training on how to utilize ABA interventions within the home environment provided to parents of multiple clients simultaneously in a group setting; this allows the parents to interact and receive feedback from each other as well, developing a sense of community and support for them.

## Service Descriptions

**Psychiatric Medication Management** – Individuals work alongside a physician or physician’s assistant to determine the safety and effectiveness of psychotropic medications. This service may include discussing symptoms, changing dosages, switching medications, or adding new medications.

**Substance Use Assessment** – Referrals complete a full assessment and SASSI to determine risk factors and current rate of use of any substances, including tobacco products and alcohol. The assessment is used to determine treatment services.


**Substance Use Counseling** – Per the assessment, individuals may participate in individual counseling to address trauma and other concerns related to their substance use or prevention needs. Those who are younger (under 12) with substance use/prevention needs are placed into individual counseling vs. group due to age.

**Substance Use Intensive Outpatient Program for Adolescents** – A program designed for individuals who are using substances at a level determined during the Assessment to be abuse. The program includes twice weekly 3-hour groups for 12 weeks (totaling 24 sessions, although the length may vary) that address addiction and recovery, teaches coping skills, addresses the root causes of continued use, and how to maintain recovery.

**Substance Use Intensive Outpatient Program for Adults** – A program designed for individuals who are using substances at a level determined during the Assessment to be abuse. The program includes 3 times weekly 3-hour groups for 12 weeks (totaling 36 sessions, although the length may vary) that address addiction and recovery, teaches coping skills, addresses the root causes of continued use, and how to maintain recovery. An additional day of IOP is offered for those needing additional support.

**Substance Use Partial Hospitalization Day Program for Adults** – A day program, operating from 9:00am – 2:00pm, for individuals ages 18+, that addresses psychological needs through individual psychiatry and psychotherapy, case management, and evidenced-based group interventions such as Dialectical Behavioral Therapy, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, and the Matrix Model. Co-occurring mental health conditions, such as anxiety, major depression, post-traumatic stress disorder, are treated as well.

**Substance Use Clinically-Managed Community Based Home for Adults** – A supportive, structured living environment for both males and females, ages 18+, designed to provide stability and skill



building to aide continued sobriety. Individuals are able to stay in this housing arrangement for up to 90 days, while also attending our Substance Use Partial Hospitalization, Intensive Outpatient, or Outpatient programs. Intercept Health has three locations for this service: Roanoke, Richmond, and Fredericksburg.

**Substance Use Group** – Prevention and education groups for individuals who are determined to benefit from this level of intervention per their assessment. Prevention and education groups may include vaping, tobacco use, etc. Groups are typically one hour twice weekly for four weeks, although the length of service may vary.

**Substance Use Continue Care Group** – Individuals who complete the IOP continue with a 1 or 2 hour per week aftercare group for up to 8 weeks to ensure successful transitioning out of the IOP.

**Substance Use Family Group** – Weekly group for families to provide education on substance use and discuss family dynamics and other relevant topics.

**Clinician-Led Alcohol/Drug Use Services** – Clinician-led group that addresses addiction and recovery by teaching coping skills, identifying the root causes of continued use, and helping individuals learn how to maintain recovery.

**Substance Use Case Management** – This service is available for anyone who is participating in Substance Use services. Case Management helps link the individual with other necessary or supplemental services.

**Substance Abuse Subtle Screening Inventory (SASSI)** – The Substance Abuse Subtle Screening Inventory (SASSI) is a brief self-report, easily administered psychological screening measure that is available in separate versions for adults and adolescents. This service includes analyzing the results of the screening to help determine the level of substance use impacting an individual.

**Suboxone Medication Appointment** – This service is for adults who may need withdrawal management services due to the use of opioids while they are participating in the Intensive Outpatient Program. Individuals are seen by the TrueNorth Psychiatric Provider to determine plan of care.

**Injection of Vivitrol** – Injection services are available for individuals being seen by a TrueNorth Psychiatric Provider when the provider and individual develop a plan of care to utilize injectable medication as part of their addiction treatment.
