The Finance Committee met in the First Floor Conference Room at 107 North Kent Street on Wednesday, March 16, 2011 at 8:00 a.m. Member Gary Lofton was absent.

(☑) Items 2 and 5 were approved on consent agenda.

- 1. The Sheriff requests a <u>General Fund supplemental appropriation in the amount</u> of \$19,670.45. No local funds required. This amount represents the following:
 - a. \$500 from the Corp of Engineers for the use of the firing range to be used for range maintenance and repairs. See attached memo, p. 1;
 - b. \$10,411.43 from the Sheriff's sale to be used for the purchase of radios to meet 2013 FCC mandates. See attached memo, p. 2;
 - c. \$5,537.14 from an insurance reimbursement to be used to repair the damaged vehicle. See attached memo, p. 3;
 - d. \$120 from donations for the DARE program. See attached memo, p. 4;
 - e. \$3,101.88 from State Forfeited Asset proceeds for the purchase of a vehicle for the Drug Task Force. See attached memo, p. 5.

Frederick County received \$522,809 in the form of a bond to complete the work at Red Bud Run in Fiscal Year 2009. Excavation and road work took place throughout 2009 and 2010. The remaining bond funds are held by the Treasurer's Office. The Planning Department has received an invoice in the amount of \$700 for work performed in the Red Bud Run subdivision in accordance with VDOT's secondary street maintenance standards.

\$ 206,686

We are asking the Finance Committee to appropriate the remaining bond funds for Red Bud Run into Expenditure Line Item #4027-12270-5413-000-002, so that Frederick County can pay this vendor for the work that was completed in November. No local funds are being used to pay this invoice. We are anticipating that the roads within Red Bud Run will be in complete compliance with VDOT standards within the next 12 months.

Attached is the invoice from Racey's Lawn Service for the work performed in Red Bud Run.

Back in November the Finance Committee reviewed a report from the Shenandoah Valley Battlefields Association (SVBF) on the use of funds provided to the Foundation by the County. The report was in accordance with the agreement between Frederick County and the SVBF pertaining to funds derived from the Star Fort property owner assessments.

The Committee will recall that the SVBF holds title to the land on which Star Fort is located. The agreement between the County and the (SVBF) sets out guidelines under which the Foundation is eligible to receive funding, derived from Star Fort home owner assessments, for the maintenance of the Fort. The agreement calls for the SVBF to submit a budget request by January first of each year outlining how they intend to utilize the funds for preservation and/or maintenance efforts at the Star Fort site. (The FY12 request has been submitted to the Finance Department) Then, in September of each year, a report is to be provided to the Board with an accounting of how the previous years' funds were utilized.

Collections in fiscal year 2010 were \$32,307. Collections to date this year are \$4,274. The County disbursed \$24,000 last fiscal year. Therefore, we have to date, \$12,581 in funds that have not disbursed.

If the Finance Committee deems it appropriate; a recommend for appropriation of this amount to line item #4-010-041040-3002-000-001 would accommodate the SVBF's request.

Daley, Clerk of the Common Council, hereby certify on this 11th day of April, 2001, that the following Resolution is a true and exact copy of one and the same unanimously adopted by the Common Council of the City of Winchester, assembled in regular session on the 10th day of April, 2001.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FREDERICK COUNTY AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WINCHESTER CREATING THE NORTHERN SHENANDOAH VALLEY TOURISM BOARD

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Frederick County Board of Supervisors and the Winchester City Council that:

1. <u>Creation</u>

There is hereby created the Northern Shenandoah Valley Tourism Board.

Purpose

The Northern Shenandoah Valley Tourism Board is established for the purpose of fostering an efficient and cooperative effort towards establishing tourism and marketing programs and strategies for the Frederick County-Winchester area.

3. Composition, Appointment, Term

The Board shall consist of a majority of private sector members.

Four members shall be appointed from motels, restaurants and the retail sector.

Three members shall be appointed from the public/non-profit sector to include:

museums arts and theater recreation and sports agriculture

tour groups events and festivals battlefields history and other

The above shall be voting members appointed jointly by the Board of Supervisors and City Council for a three year term on a staggered basis. Initial term shall include:

- A. Two private sector and one public non-profit sector appointments for three years;
- B. One private sector and one public/non—profit for two years; and,
- C. One private sector and one public/non-profit for one year. Thereafter, all terms shall be three years.

The following shall each appoint a non-voting representative on an annual basis.

- 1. Frederick County Board of Supervisors
- 2. Winchester City Council
- 3. Winchester-Frederick County EDC Board member
- 4. Chamber of Commerce Board member
- 5. Old Town Development Board member

The following will be available to provide staff support to the Board:

Frederick County Administrator
Winchester City Manager
Frederick County Director of Planning
Winchester Director of Planning
Winchester-Frederick County Chamber of Commerce Visitor Center

4. The Board shall recommend an organizational chart and bylaws, which shall be approved by the Board of Supervisors and City Council. The annual budget shall also be approved by the Board and Council

5. <u>Program Funding</u>

- A. Each jurisdiction shall contribute \$160,000 to the initial program year (2001—2002). Future year contributions shall be made on a 50%—50% basis.
- B. The maximum funds allocated by the jurisdictions to the program in future years shall be based on the percentage of increase in combined City and County motel tax receipts over the prior year. As an example, the maximum 2002-2003 program year allocation from the County and City shall be \$320,000 plus the percentage of increase in combined motel tax receipts. A 5% increase in motel tax receipts would equal \$16,000 (\$8,000 per jurisdiction) in additional tourism funds for a total public sector contribution of \$336,000.

Interest income shall be added to this fund total.

The City of Winchester shall serve a fiscal agent beginning July 1, 2001. The Board may opt to become its own fiscal agent or use another entity with approval of the Board of Supervisors and City Council. The City shall provide a monthly statement of beginning balance; public sector dollars added; private sector dollars added and expenditures by line item to the Tourism Board and contributing jurisdictions.

C. A private sector match of a minimum of 20% of the public sector contributions shall be included in the program budget. This shall include marketing and advertising payments made directly by participating Frederick County and Winchester businesses.

6. Compensation

All members of the Northern Shenandoah Valley Tourism Board shall serve without compensation.

7. Organization, Officers, Quorum

The members of the Northern Shenandoah Valley Tourism Board shall, as soon as possible after their appointment, meet and organize. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary and other such officers as it may deem necessary. A majority of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum. All by-laws shall be approved by the Frederick County Board of Supervisors and the Winchester City Council.

8. Reports and Budgets

At least once each quarter, the Board shall make a full written report to the Frederick County Board of Supervisors and the Winchester City Council showing the activities of the Board for the previous quarter. Once each year the Board shall submit a report of its goals and proposed activities for the coming year. The Board shall also annually submit a budget to the Board and Council.

9. Program Transition

The existing tourism contract shall remain in effect until June 30, 2001.

The Chamber of Commerce Tourism Director shall serve as Interim Tourism Executive Director until the Tourism Board appoints a new Director.

Frederick County shall continue as fiscal agent until June 30, 2001. The City shall become fiscal agent July 1, 2001. The City shall prepare a monthly statement of beginning balance; public sector dollars added; private sector dollars added; other income added, and expenditures by line item to the Tourism Board and the contributing jurisdictions.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

FREDERICK COUNTY AND CITY OF WINCHESTER JOINT AGREEMENTS

I. PURPOSE

The County of Frederick (herein referred to as "County") and the City of Winchester (herein referred to as "City") are entering into this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to serve as an agreement, based upon the recommendation of the County and City Joint Finance Committee, and adopted by resolution by the County Board of Supervisors in regular session on December 14, 1994, and the City Common Council in regular session on December 13, 1994, to determine the structure and funding of all joint projects.

II. GENERAL CONCEPTS

The following general concepts for all the joint funded projects will apply:

- (1) City and County will agree to entire contents of this memorandum for understanding, not just portions.
- (2) Funding will be determined by usage when available. Usage will be determined by the prior calendar year data for estimates and revised to the prior fiscal year when data is available. When usage is not available, funding shall be based on population, using the most recent data available from the Cooper Center for Public Service, University of Virginia.
- (3) Representation will be determined by population or usage and changes will be made as current terms expire. A Joint Finance Committee, representing two members from both the City Finance Committee and County Finance Committee, will oversee that representation is based on relationship to funding.
- (4) Budgets will be reviewed by the Joint Finance Committee with the program managers prior to budget sessions. Budgets will be submitted at present level and any increases will be separate and/or approved on a case by case basis. Funding will be determined by agreed formulas as outlined in Section III of this MOU.

Either jurisdiction may elect to keep funding for a program at the existing level or reduce it. When this occurs, the other jurisdiction has the right to reduce funding on a proportional basis or provide supplemental funding on a non-matching basis, as it desires.

- (5) Fiscal agents will remain the same at this time with no assessed fee. However, if the fiscal agent relationships do change, the Joint Finance Committee will analyze the funding impact to the new fiscal agent for that function.
- (6) Capital projects and funding will be considered for approval by the Joint Finance Committee on a case by case basis. Funding will also be determined by usage or population.
- (7) All joint funded budgets will be approved once a resolution has been adopted by both the City and County approving same.
- (8) All agreements shall be effective July 1, 1994 and retroactive to the beginning of the 1994-1995 budget. New board/committee appointments shall be effective November 1994.
- (9) Joint agencies funded by the City and County shall refer other agencies seeking funds to the Joint Finance Committee and not fund them directly.
- (10) Each fiscal agent shall prepare a quarterly report indicating each account's and fund's status as follows:
 - o Beginning cash balance;
 - o Revenues by source (each local jurisdiction's state and/or federal funds, other major sources and, miscellaneous income if less than \$10,000 per month);
 - Expenditures by category (personnel, contractual, commodity, and capital); and
 - o Ending cash balance. Each jurisdiction shall receive a report of line transactions for each project on an annual basis.
- (11) The relocation of offices and/or facilities or the establishment of additional offices and/or facilities of any of the joint projects shall be approved in advance by the governing body of each participating jurisdiction; the use of facilities, equipment and/or personnel financed with funds from a joint project shall be restricted to those programs funded; and use of these items for other purposes shall require approval by both jurisdictions and compensation from the using jurisdiction; and quarterly basis to the participating localities.

(12) This MOU will supersede all existing agreements effective July 1, 1994. Separate agreements will be developed and existing agreements will be revised to reflect the MOU as necessary. The City and County will honor all changes made until the new agreements, state action, regional approvals, etc. are completed and approved. The City and County attorneys shall prepare necessary documents to implement this MOU.

III. AGREEMENTS

A. <u>DETOX</u>

1. <u>Funding</u>: Will be determined by usage. The previous calendar year statistics were used to determine funding for on-going budget preparations. Fiscal Year 1994-1995 usage will be as follows:

City - 78.86%

County - 21.32%

Presentation: No formal committee will be formed. Presently one County and City representative is appointed to serve on the Community Corrections Resources Board and one County and City representative is appointed to serve on the ASAP Policy Board.

B. JUDICIAL CENTER

- 1. <u>Funding</u>: Funding will remain the same with 50% funded by the County and 50% funded by the City.
- 2. Representation: Not necessary at this time.

C. JAIL

The County and City will authorize Bell Atlantic to begin the immediate upgrade of the current central dispatch system to an enhanced 911 system. Staff will prepare cost estimates for a new central dispatch center to be located in the basement of Frederick Winchester Judicial Center. Until such time the following will apply to this joint venture:

1. Funding:

Central Dispatch: 50% funded by police (45% - City and 5% - County) and 50% funding by fire and rescue (25% - City and 25% - County). At such time when the Frederick County Sheriff's department is included in this configuration, funding will be changed to reflect usage.

<u>E911</u>: Initial Operations and Fixed Assets - 50% funded by City and 50% funded by County. After the new system is in operation, charges will be based on usage.

The City's Director of Central Dispatch/E911 will direct the Central Dispatch/E911 functions and advise the committee. The committee will serve as an advisory body to the public safety members who provide emergency services to Frederick/Winchester.

H. FIRE AND RESCUE/MUTUAL AID

The County has adopted a plan to upgrade county services in order to reduce the number of fire and rescue responses made into the county by city units. Advanced Life Support Medical Services have been identified as the highest priority service upgrade needed. The County authorized the implementation of two advanced life support rapid response units to be staffed on a 24 hour basis. One unit will operate from the Gainesboro Fire Station to service Western Frederick County and the second unit will operate from the Greenwood Fire Station to service the north and east regions of the county. The southern sections of the county will be serviced with existing resources.

The City will not furnish to the County primary aerial ladder truck service beginning in January, 1998.

The Joint Finance Committee shall review service deficits on an annual basis. If data for a particular service reflects a deficit in excess of 10 percent, the receiving jurisdiction shall take actions necessary to reduce it.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF FREDERICK AND THE FREDERICK COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY - APPROVED

This Memorandum of Understanding is between Frederick County, Virginia (the "County") and the Industrial Development Authority of the County of Frederick, Virginia (the "Authority") and is dated this ____ day of October, 1994.

RECITALS

A. On September 30, 1994, the Authority acquired certain property from Courthouse Associates limited Partnership in anticipation of a subsequent lease of that property to the County. The purchase price for that property was provided by the County.

- B. The County has requested the Authority to acquire tain other property, currently owned by F&M Bank hachester, which is also expected to be leased to the County.
- C. The County has also requested that the Authority issue is lease revenue bonds to finance the acquisition of the poperty described above, and the construction, renovation and apping of that property for use of an office complex by the inty.
- D. The County and the Authority desire to set forth their and understandings regarding the property described above and bond financing related thereto, as follows:

UNDERSTANDINGS

- 1. The Authority agrees to accept title to the F&M Bank W achester property described above as and when requested by the C inty.
- 2. The purchase price and all expenses relating to the a quisition of such property are to be provided by the County at n expense to the Authority.
- 3. The Authority will have no responsibility or liability f r any matter related to the ownership or operation of any of t e property described above, including without limitation any sponsibility for maintenance or repair of such property or u der any lease now or hereafter in effect with respect to any p rtion of such property; it being understood that the County shall be responsible for all such matters.
- 4. The County agrees to provide all insurance, including bility insurance and property insurance, for the property scribed above, and further agrees to cause the Authority to be nimed as an additional insured with respect to all such policies insurance.
- 5. All rent or other payments received by the Authority the respect to the property described above shall be remitted to the County as and when received, except for rent received by the Authority from the County itself under the lease or leases the entered into in connection with the bond financing, which rent shall be applied as described in the bond documentation.
- 6. In order to provide funds to reimburse the County for the purchase price of the property described above and to provide other funds for the construction, renovation and equipping of the County office complex, the Authority agrees to issue the bonds described above in such amounts and pursuant to such terms and documentation as may be agreed upon by the County and the Authority, as allowed by law.
- 7. The Authority hereby approves the engagement of Wheat First Butcher Singer as the underwriter for the bond issue in a cordance with the terms described in the engagement letter from Wheat First Butcher Singer to the Authority dated October 1994, and authorizes any officer of the Authority to execute sight letter.
- 8. In the event the bond financing is abandoned by the Canty, the Authority agrees to convey the property described above to the County or its designee, provided that all costs and expenses in connection with such conveyances are paid by the Canty.

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Winchester-Frederick County Tourism Board **BYLAWS**

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Established April 11, 2001 Amended: October 9, 2003 May 17, 2007 June 21, 2007 January 20, 2011

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Winchester-Frederick County Tourism Board BYLAWS

ARTICLE I Name

The name of the organization is the Winchester-Frederick County Tourism Board and is hereinafter and alternatively called the "WFCTB".

ARTICLEII Creation

Section 1. The WFCTB was created by adoption of Concurrent Resolution Number 2001-22 of the Board of Supervisors of Frederick County and the Common Council of the City of Winchester.

Section 2. The Common Council of the City of Winchester adopted the Concurrent resolution referenced in Article II, Section 1 above on April 10, 2001, and the Board of Supervisors of Frederick County adopted the same on April 11, 2001.

ARTICLE III Administrative Office

The administrative office of the WFCTB is 1400 South Pleasant Valley Road, Winchester, Virginia 22601.

ARTICLE IV Purpose & Mission

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of the WFCTB is to provide guidance and leadership to the *Winchester-Frederick County Convention & Visitors Bureau* (hereinafter and alternatively called the WFCVB) in the WFCVB's effort to promote tourism-related service providers, organizations, attractions, museums and points of interest throughout the region so long as the City of Winchester, Virginia, and Frederick County, Virginia, will benefit either directly or indirectly.

Section 2. Mission. The mission of the WFCTB is to provide oversight, guidance, and leadership to the WFCVB in the WFCVB's efforts 1) to offer Winchester-Frederick County area visitors and guests the best possible travel experienced and adventures in discovery in the Shenandoah Valley; 2) to build economic security with in the Winchester-Frederick County area, and across the region through revenue-generating tourism marketing initiatives; and 3) to preserve, protect and promote the natural agricultural, cultural, and historical assets of the Winchester-Frederick County area by building economic value in those assets through growth in tourism.

ARTICLE V WFCTB Responsibilities

- **Section 1.** Annual Budget. The WFCTB Finance Committee shall recommend, and the WFCTB voting members shall by majority vote approve for submittal, and annual budget to the Winchester City Council and Frederick County Board of Supervisors for review and approval.
- Section 2. Annual Reports. At the end of each year the WFCTB shall make a full written report to the Winchester City Council and the Frederick County Board of Supervisors reporting activities of the WFCTB.
- **Section 3. Budgetary Oversight.** The WFCTB shall ensure program funding and provide fiscal oversight of budgetary expenditures by WFCTB staff.
- **Section 4. Organizational Chart.** The WFCTB Personnel Committee shall recommend, and the WFCTB voting members by majority vote approve for submittal, an organizational chart to the Winchester City Council and Frederick County Board of Supervisors for review and approval.
- **Section 5. WFCVB Oversight.** The WFCTB shall oversee the operation and administration of the WFCVB.
- **Section 6. Executive Director.** The WFCTB shall appoint an Executive Director of the WFCVB and shall evaluate the performance of the WFCVB Executive Director once a year.

Section 7. Tourism Strategy and Master Plan

- a. The WFCTB, along with the WFCVB Executive Director and staff, shall develop, adopt and oversee a tourism marketing strategy and master plan that takes into account the following:
 - 1) stakeholder concerns and recommendations;
 - 2) regional tourism issues;
 - 3) other regional CVB tourism master plans;
 - 4) state tourism authority policies and plans;
 - 5) federal, state and local tourism-related legislative issues, goals and initiatives;
 - 6) historical preservation and integrity;
 - 7) the operational authority of WFCVB staff and the WFCTB;

- **b.** The WFCTB shall review and revise tourism marketing strategies and master plans on an annual basis
- c. The WFCTB shall submit the master plan to the City of Winchester City Council and Frederick County Board of Supervisors for review and approval.
- d. The WFCTB shall develop tourism marketing strategies and master plans that foster efficient and cooperative efforts to establish tourism marketing and development programs for the Winchester-Frederick County area.

ARTICLE VI City of Winchester & Frederick County Assurances of Staff Support

Paragraph 3 of Concurrent Resolution Number 2001-22 of the Board of Supervisors of Frederick County and the Common Council of the City of Winchester authorizes the WFCTB to request staff support from the following officials.

- a. The Frederick County Administrator
- b. The Frederick County Director of Planning
- c. The Winchester City Manager
- d. The Winchester Director of Planning

ARTICLE VII Members

- Section 1. Composition of the WFCTB. The fourteen member WFCTB will consist of 1) five private sector voting representatives; 2) four public/non-profit sector voting representatives; and 3) five economic development/local government non-voting representatives. The WFCTB shall not exceed nine voting and five non-voting members, all of whom must be from currently operating entities in the above-enumerated sectors. Whenever possible, members should be appointed to the WFCTB in such a manner as to provide fair representation of both City of Winchester and Frederick County interests.
- Section 2. Private Sector Representative Membership. Five voting members of the WFCTB shall be appointed from among the board members, owners and managers of for-profit motel/hotel, restaurant and retail or professional business establishments located AND OPERATED WITHIN THE POLITICAL BOUNDARIES OF THE City of Winchester, Virginia, or Frederick County, Virginia. No fewer than two of the five private sector members shall be appointed from motel/hotel business establishments.
- Section 3. Public/Non-profit Sector Representative Membership. Four voting members of the WFCTB shall be appointed from among the board members and executive staff of public/non-profit sector organizations. For purposes of selecting WFCTB appointees, public/non-profit sector organizations shall be defined as tourism-oriented organizations established, organized, operated and located within the political boundaries of the City of Winchester,

Virginia, or Frederick County, Virginia, for the sole purpose of operating, overseeing, or founding entities or activities related to the following:

- a. Museums
- b. Tour Groups
- c. Arts and Theater
- d. Events and Festivals
- e. Recreation and Sports
- f. Battlefields
- g. Agriculture
- h. History and Historical Preservation

Section 4. Economic Development/Local Government Representative Membership. The following five economic development/local government entities shall each appoint to the WFCTB one non-voting member from among its own members:

- a. Frederick County Board of Supervisors
- b. Winchester City Council
- c. Winchester-Frederick County EDC Board
- d. Winchester-Frederick County Chamber of Commerce Board
- e. Winchester Old Town Development Board

If a presiding board or council member of the above-listed entities initiates a written request to the WFCTB seeking appointee recommendations, the WFCTB may submit appointee recommendations to or submit nominees for consideration before the above-listed entities.

Section 5. Member Compensation. All members of the WFCTB shall serve without compensation. However, any member, voting or non-voting, shall be reimbursed for expenses pre-approved in writing by the Chairperson and Finance Committee Chairperson of the WFCTB.

Section. Member Appointment Process. In the event of an actual or anticipated member vacancy on the WFCTB, the following process shall apply:

- a. The Winchester-Frederick County Tourism Board Chairperson appoints a
 Nominating Committee in accordance with WFCTB Bylaws Article IX, Sections
 1, 4, 5, 6 and 8, for WFCTB Bylaws Article VII, Section 2 and 3 appointment nominees.
- b. The Nominating Committee selects nominees in accordance with Article VII, Sections 1, 2 and 3 of these Bylaws. Bylaws Article VII, Section 4 appointments are unilaterally made by the entities listed there under.
- c. The Nominating Committee submits names of nominees to the Frederick County Board of Supervisors and the Winchester City Council.
- d. The Frederick County Board of Supervisors and the Winchester City Council vote on whether to accept nominees to the Winchester-Frederick County Tourism Board.

Section 7. Member Terms.

- a. Voting Members. Voting members shall serve three consecutive years beginning on July 1 following the date of official appointment and ending on June 30 of the third year.
- b. Non-Voting Members. Non-Voting members shall serve two consecutive years beginning on July 1 following the date of official appointment and ending June 30 of the second year.
- c. Midterm Member Vacancies. In the event that a member resigns or is removed for cause from the WFCTB before the expiration of such member's term, a new member shall be appointed in accordance with Bylaws Article VII, Sections 4 and/or 6, and serve the remainder of the term of a vacating member.
- d. Member Term Renewal. Current voting members of the WFCTB shall be automatically nominated for subsequent terms no fewer than sixty (60) days before expiration of such member's term as delineated by Bylaws Article VII, Section 8(e) below unless...
 - A current WFCTB voting member subject to automatic nomination submits written notice to the WFCTB Chairperson, WFCTB Nominating Committee Chairperson and WFCVB Executive Director rejecting such member's nomination for a subsequent term no later than sixty (60) days before expiration of his or her term; or
 - 2) A majority of WFCTB voting members submit written notice to the WFCTB Chairperson, WFCTB Nominating Committee Chairperson and WFCVB Executive Director rejecting such member's nomination for a subsequent term no later than sixty (60) days before expiration of his or her term. Non-voting members shall be nominated and appointed for subsequent terms at the sole discretion of the entities appointing such members, subject to Bylaws Article VII, Section 8(e) below.

e. Member Term Limits

- Voting members shall serve no more than two consecutive or four non-consecutive three-year terms, excluding the remainder of terms served to fill WFCTB vacancies in accordance with Bylaws Article VII, Section 8(c).
- Non-voting members shall serve no more than three consecutive or four non-consecutive two-year terms, excluding the remainder of terms served to fill WFCTB vacancies in accordance with Bylaws Article VII, Section 8(c).

- **Section 8. Resignation from Membership.** Any member desiring to resign from the WFCTB shall submit his or her resignation in writing to the WFCTB Chairperson, WFCTB Nominating Committee Chairperson and WFCVB Executive Director. Member resignation shall be effective on the date of the regularly scheduled WFCTB meeting immediately following the date the resignation is stipulated in the written notice of resignation and is accepted by the WFCTB Chairperson.
- **Section 9. Member Removal for Cause.** Any voting member may be removed from office or from the WFCTB, for cause, by a vote of two-thirds of all WFCTB voting members. Removal may occur only at a meeting for which written notice has been given that a purpose of the meeting is removal of a member. Non-voting members may be removed, for any reason, only by the entities that appointed such members.
- **Section 10. Membership of WFCVB Executive Director.** The executive Director of the WFCVB shall serve as a member of the WFCTB in an *ex officio* capacity.

ARTICLE VIII Officers

- **Section 1. Officers and Duties.** The officers of the WFCTB shall be a chairperson, a Vice Chairperson and any such other officers as the WFCTB may deem necessary. These officers shall perform the duties prescribed by these Bylaws and by the parliamentary authority adopted by the WFCTB.
- Section 2. Term of Office. The WFCTB shall elect by ballot all officers for two-year terms or for terms coinciding with the remainder of the officers' WFCTB member terms, whichever is shorter.
- Section 3. Election of Officers. Members shall be elected or re-elected for WFCTB offices by a majority of voting WFCTB members during the regularly-scheduled June WFCTB meeting immediately preceding the expiration date of each two-year officer term. Newly elected and re-elected officers shall serve two-year terms beginning on July 1 following the date of election or re-election. Current officers shall continue to serve through June 30 following the date of election on or re-election of officers.
- Section 4. Officer Qualifications. Officers shall be elected from among voting WFCTB members selected in accordance with Article VII, Sections 1, 2, and 3 of the Bylaws.

- Section 5. Nomination Procedure. At the regularly scheduled WFCTB meeting held in April, an Officer Nominating Committee of two members shall be selected in accordance with WFCTB Bylaws Article IX, Section 1. it shall be the duty of this committee to nominate candidates for the offices to be filled at the regularly scheduled WFCTB meeting in May. Before the election at the regularly scheduled meeting in June, additional nominations from the floor shall be permitted.
- **Section 6. Office-Holding Limitations.** No member shall hold more than one office at a time, and no member may hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms or three non-consecutive terms, excluding the remainder of officer terms served to fill WFCTB vacancies and officer resignations.
- Section 7. Office Vacancies. In the event an officer resigns his or her office or withdraws from membership on the WFCTB, an interim officer shall be elected in accordance with the terms of this Article VIII, except that such interim officer shall be nominated and elected at the next regularly scheduled WFCTB meeting. The interim officer shall serve the remainder of the vacating officer's term.

ARTICLE IX Committees

- Section 1. Member & officer Nominating Committees. The WFCTB Chairperson shall appoint no more than two WFCTB voting members to nominating committees, as need for the nominating committee arises. Nominating committees will be responsible for recruitment and nomination of individuals for specific WFCTB member and officer vacancies. Only voting members of the WFCTB shall serve on nominating committees. A nominating committee shall automatically dissolve once the purpose for which it was organized has been accomplished.
- **Section 2. Permanent Committees.** The WFCTB Chairperson shall appoint no more than two WFCTB members to any single permanent committee. Only voting members of the WFCTB shall serve on the Permanent committees. Permanent committees will be added to these Bylaws as they are established by a majority vote of WFCTB voting members. Permanent Committees established are:
 - a. Finance Committee: This committee provides fiscal oversight of budgetary expenditures by WFCTB staff.
 - Personnel Committee: This committee provides WFCVB personnel oversight,
 reviews all hiring decisions and reviews the performance of the WFCVB
 Executive Director. The personnel committee reports its findings to the WFCTB.

- **Section 3.** Ad Hoc Committees and Task Forces. The WFCTB Chairperson shall appoint such committees and task forces to carry out the objectives, purposes mission and responsibilities of the WFCTB as deemed necessary.
- Section 4. Committee Membership. Each permanent and nominating committee shall include no more than two voting members of the WFCTB, one member representing the private/for-profit sector and the other representing the public/non-profit sector as defined under Article VII of these Bylaws. Each ad hoc committee and/or task force shall include no more than two members of the WFCTB, but such ad hoc committees or task forces may include up to twelve members- up to ten non-WFCTB advisory members, and no fewer than two WFCTB members as well as individuals having a demonstrable interest in regional tourism, may serve on ad hoc committees and task forces.
- Section 5. Committee Chairperson. The chairperson of permanent committees shall be elected by voting members of the WFCTB in accordance with WFCTB Bylaws Article VIII, Section 3. the chairperson of ad hoc committees and task forces shall be elected by the majority of voting WFCTB members at the next regularly schedule WFCTB meeting following formation of the committee or task force. Nominating committees shall have no chairpersons.
- Section 6. Committee Member Terms. Members of permanent and ad hoc committees and task forces shall serve two-year terms, or shall serve until the end of their WFCTB membership terms, or until the WFCTB dissolves the committee or task force in accordance with WFCTB Bylaws Article IX, Section 7, whichever is shorter.
- **Section 7. Committee Dissolution.** Permanent committees may be dissolved by a two-thirds vote of all voting WFCTB members. Ad hoc committees and task forces may be dissolved by a majority vote of all voting WFCTB members.
- Section 8. Multiple Committee Membership. Voting WFCTB members may serve on multiple committees and task forces. Non-voting WFCTB members may serve on multiple ad hoc committees and task forces only. Non-WFCTB members may serve on no more than one ad hoc committee task force.

ARTICLE X Meetings

- Section 1. Regular Meetings. The regular meetings of the WFCTB shall be held at 8:00 am on the third Thursday of each month from July to June inclusive, unless otherwise ordered by the WFCTB in accordance with the notice requirements of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act.
- **Section 2. Quorum.** A majority of the voting members of the WFCTB shall constitute a quorum. Proxies are not permitted.

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Section 3. Attendance. Each member will make every effort to attend all WFCTB meetings. If a member is not able to attend a WFCTB meeting, such member must notify the Chairperson through the Executive Director in advance. Should a member be absent for more than two consecutive meetings without notice and without valid excuse, the member's appointment to the WFCTB will conclude, and a new appointment to fill the vacancy will be made in accordance with these Bylaws. For purposes of this Section, a valid excuse shall be defined as an unforeseen event that precludes member attendance and that prevents timely notice of absence.

Section 4. Special Meetings. Special meetings may be called by the Chairperson or called at the written request of two or more voting or non-voting members of the WFCTB. The purpose of the meeting shall be stated in the call. Except in cases of emergency, at least three days' written notice shall be given. Notice of special and emergency meetings shall be given in accordance with the Virginia Freedom of Information Act.

ARTICLE XI Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly revised shall govern the WFCTB in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with federal, state or local law, these Bylaws and any special rules of order the WFCTB may adopt.

ARTICLE XII Amendment of Bylaws

These bylaws may be amended at any regular scheduled meeting of the Board by a two-thirds vote, provided that the amendment has been submitted in writing at the previous regularly scheduled WFCTB meeting.

Balance Sheet

Cash-

The cash has decreased \$3,046,095.60 over the previous year as a result of the cost of the capital projects.

Receivables-

The receivables at 2/28/11 are \$17,980.23 more than at 2/28/10. The Landfill fee charges for 2/11 were \$345,415.07 compared to \$288,316.42 2/10 resulting in a FY11 increase of \$57,098.55. The landfill delinquent fees were \$131,162.47 at 2/11 compared to \$170,236.64 at 2/10 for a decrease of \$39,074.17.

Accumulated Depreciation-

The depreciation for FY10 is reflected in the FY11 total.

Accrued Remediation Costs-

The accrued remediation cost has increased \$93,824.80 from FY10 to FY11. The Department of Environmental Quality requires funds to be set aside annually for the closure of the Regional Landfill. Currently, the County maintains \$11.5 million for closure costs in a separate trust fund.

Encumbrances-

Encumbrances decreased \$724,367.55. The encumbrance balance is \$2,866,177.45 at 2/28/11 and includes \$10,567.20 for CAT parts, \$1,670,599.01 for the partial capping MSW, \$221,400.00 for the gas to energy project, \$35,820.00 for remote data terminal for scale house, \$71,777.00 for CAES system for a D5, \$540,330.00 Caterpillar 826H, and \$315,684.24 for expansion leachate.

Fund Balance-

Total Fund Balance at 2/28/11 increased by \$1,823,214.30. At year-end, all reserved fund balances increased with continued funds being reserved for items such as land acquisition and post closure costs.
